
The Mass Flight of 1944

Eighty years have passed since the Estonian people's destiny

took a drastic turn. The Soviet Union seized control of the country, subjecting it to a 50-year occupation until the last Soviet army troops left in 1994. Around 80,000 Estonian citizens were uprooted from their homes,

fleeing the imminent Soviet occupation. They became displaced persons and refugees avoiding facing the grim alternatives of death, imprisonment, or exile in the Siberian Gulag. They left their homes and loved ones behind forever. Many fled by small and large boats across the sea, and by any available means of transportation. This is now know as the Mass Flight of 1944 (Suurpõgenemine 1944). Thousands perished in this desperate flight westward.

commissioned a memorial sculpture by Estonian artist Elo Liiv which is scheduled to open in Pärnu on September 21st. Dedicated to all Estonians who suffered due to the Mass Flight, the sculpture

will be erected on the banks of the Pärnu River, next to a bridge where thousands of departed, ships on land donated by the Pärnu City Government. Deeply symbolic and emotional, the sculpture is called "the touch" and depicts the moment of farewell when fingers of the departing still touch those of the ones left behind. Longing is in the fingertips and hearts and it's the final moment of togetherness. In the palm, both small and large ships can be seen.

The St. Peter's and Vana Andres congregations, will be commemorating the Mass Flight on September 22nd with a combined service at St. Peters.
