What does the name "Tõe Tera"

mean? In English, it means "Grain of Truth". The name of our monthly bulletin is based on the Parable of the Sower (sometimes called the Parable of the Soils) found in Matthew 13:3-9, Mark 4:1-20, Luke 8:4-15, and the extra-canonical Gospel of Thomas.

Jesus tells of a farmer who sows seed indiscriminately. Some seed falls on the path (wayside) with no soil, some

on rocky ground with little soil, some on soil which contains thorns, and some on good soil. In the first case, the seed is taken away; in the second and third soils, the seed fails

to produce a crop; but when it falls on good soil, it grows and yields thirty-, sixty-, or a hundred-fold.

Jesus later explains to his disciples that the seed represents the Gospel, the sower represents anyone who

proclaims it, and the various soils represent people's responses to it.

Heritage Register

The property known as 817 Mount Pleasant Road is now officially

included on the Heritage Register! Inclusion on the Register involved a three-step process. The first step involved the Toronto Preservation Board, on April 24th, recommending to the North York Community Council that the City Council include the property located at 817 Mount Pleasant Road on the City of Toronto's Heritage Register based on a presentation by a Senior Manager, Heritage Planning, Urban Design, City Planning. From there, the North York Community Council considered the recommendation, and on May 16th. adopted it without amendment. On June 14th, the City adopted Toronto recommendation without amendments and without debate.

Columbarium Closure Application

Since the congregation voted not to sell the church, there are no funds available to close the columbarium and relocate those interred in the niches, and The Funeral, Burial and Cremation Act Registrar was notified thereof. The withdrawal of the Application was confirmed by the Registrar on June 30th.

Repairs and Maintenance

A thorough assessment of the church property is currently being undertaken. Erik Kalm, our facility manager, is hard at work evaluating the repairs that are urgently required. Our priority is our precious copper roof which needs some tender loving care. We are getting estimates from qualified roofing companies. We are also happy to report that the pastor's apartment is



in great shape. It is architecturally outstanding thanks to the renovation undertaken for Archbishop emeritus Andres Taul by his wife Eneri. We are in the process of refreshing it in preparation for rental. If you, or anyone you know is looking to rent a three bedroom apartment, of 1200 sq. feet, with updated appliances and free parking. please call the church office for an appointment.

Talgud at St. Peter's - July 17 – 21

The Estonian word "talgud" means to gather to carry out a major task, or cooperate in voluntary work, and this is exactly what occurred last week at Toronto Peetri Kirik. Crews of volunteers moved about the church clearing out cupboards, taking inventory of books, moving furniture, assessing archival materials, wiping down shelving, packing dusty curtains, and painting. The Ladies Guild supplied the hungry crew with plenty of hot coffee, cool drinks, sandwiches, and home baking.



The church apartment had an entire library of religious books that had been left behind by the various ministers that had lived there. All of the books were sorted, with some being donated, others given to the archives, and some moved downstairs so that in the future we may establish a reference library. Some very old and interesting Bibles were discovered which we hope to have on display at an upcoming service.

The archive room now has more shelving space. The back cupboards and hymnals in the sanctuary have been inventoried and reorganized.

The Ladies Guild room was given a make-over of sorts with furniture being moved and cupboards reorganized. Have a look in the office, there has been some furniture movement in there as well to make visitors feel cozy.

The total man-hours (and woman-hours) were well over 200! Many hours of prep-work, picking up materials, and baking, are not included in that



number. We are so gratified by the love people show for our church through their personal effort. When we next have our "talgud", please come join us, make new friends, and help to ensure our congregation's continued sustain-ability. There is much to be done! A church is an organization that runs on the help and dedication of volunteers. There are many roles to fill. We know everyone does not have the time or the physical ability to participate in our "talgud", but we welcome whatever encouragement you can give, be it verbal or financial.
