Grace and Peace to each of you!

We are journeying towards the season of Advent and then into the Christmas season!

Did you know the church year ends on Sunday, November 26th and we start into a new church year with the beginning of Advent? The season of Advent is the four weeks before Christmas, from Sunday December 3rd until December 24th. The word Advent, from Latin means "to come". Advent means "coming" or "entrance" or "arrival". It refers to the expectation of Jesus' coming, who is Saviour of the world first as a baby in Bethlehem on Christmas, and also the anticipation of the fullness of time at Christ's second coming.



During this season we yearn and prepare for the presence of Christ! We are invited to slow down and breathe. I read that "We sit with Isaiah and his people who longingly

Promised One. We stand with John the Baptist as he calls God's people to prepare the way of the Lord. This slowing down makes room for the Spirit to show us those things in our own hearts and in our own congregations and systems that we might rather leave undisturbed and unacknowledged." There are many themes during this season: hope, darkness/light, repentance, watchfulness, preparation, expectation, and anticipation.

The season of Christmas begins on December 24th. What brings you joy, peace, and hope, at Christmas? Please take a few moments to reflect on this question over the comina days and weeks. I also invite you to take the time to read through Luke 2:1-20, the birth of Jesus. Each of us will read and hear this story through a unique lens. It may help center us within this challenging and uncertain world around us. It may gift us a renewed lens of love and hope for the world we live within and then move us into action as the hands and feet of Christ for our neighbour.

made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. Jõulud, meie Issanda, Jumala ja päästja Jeesuse Kristuse sündimise püha, sisaldavad sedavõrd palju rõõmu, et ei mahu ära ühte päeva, vaid kestavad kuni k o I m e k u n i n g a p ä e v a ehk ilmumispühani välja. Issanda sündimise tähistamist alustatakse jõululaupäeva õhtuteenistusega. 25. detsembril on Kristuse sündimise püha. Teist jõulupüha on peetud esimärter Stefanose mälestuspäevana, kolmandat evangelist Johannese ja neljandat süütalastepäevana Petlemmas mõrvatud laste mälestuseks. Jõuluaja pühaderingis mõtleme ka pühale perekonnale (1. pühapäev pärast jõule) ja Jeesuse pühale nimele (kaheksas päev jõuludest, uusaasta).

Vanasti toodi jõuludeks õled tuppa ja lapsed magasid siis õlgede peal nagu jõululaps sõimes. Jõuluööl valvame koos karjastega, laulame koos inglitega, oleme sõime juures koos Maarjaga ning rõõmustame Õnnistegija sündimise üle koos kogu ristirahvaga. Me ei pea selleks ette võtma pikka teekonda Petlemma – Kristuses tuleb Jumal Ise meie juurde.

Armas Taevane Isa, me täname Sind, et Sa oled maailma nõnda palju armastanud, et oled andnud oma Poja meile päästjaks! 
